Many educational awareness programmers were organized by the organization during the year 2017-18 to enhance the value of education in the communities.

Asha Deep Foundation is running several projects like St. James Convent School for the underprivileged children, Gali Pre School for the Children of Rag Picking Community, Creche for the children whose parents are involved in rag picking, Remedial classes for the children who were admitted in the formal school but unable to perform well in their studies, After School Support to the children of underprivileged communities etc. The organisation is reaching to more than 5000 children indirectly and to 2000 children directly and bringing development through quality education.

The organisation works with a motive to bring Sustainable Development through quality education and empowers people to change the way they think and work towards a sustainable future. UNESCO also aims to improve access to quality education on sustainable development at all levels and in all social contexts, to transform society by reorienting education and help people develop knowledge, skills, values and behaviours needed for sustainable development. The organisation believes in strong education system and provides opportunities to the underprivileged and minority communities.

INTRODUCTION

Asha Deep Foundation (ADF) is a Non-Profit Organization, carrying out development activities since 1983 in Delhi, Chennai, Mumbai, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. Since its inception, the emphasis was given on the holistic development of the community people with a special focus on Education, Health and Livelihood through 23 different welfare projects.

The purpose of the Society is to work among underprivileged people who live in urban and rural areas so that they may be empowered and enriched to shape their own destiny. It is executing the



development activities in the urban slums, resettlement colonies and rural to reach out maximum number of community people who are socially, economically, politically and culturally disadvantaged. The society firmly believes in the holistic development in its totality of the community people.

Therefore, all efforts are made to bring a positive change in the overall situation of deprived community by introducing number of activities for their development. This is the strong belief of the society that a unique social order can only be maintained by involving every individual to experience the benefits of development. Hence, the society is presently working with nearly 5 million people of its targeted intervention area. The foundation is running projects for underprivileged people and almost all the people of the community e.g. women, children, senior citizen, physically challenged and orphan and destitute are being benefited by the programmes.

OUR NEW VENTURES

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME – (YDP)

Asha Deep Foundation, in collaboration with Bank of America has launched Skill Development Centres in three cities - Chennai, Gurugram and Mumbai, for those actively seeking skilled employment under Youth Development Programme. Each centre trains two batches of 25 students each in the morning and evening shift. Moreover, Chennai and Mumbai centres also provide a one-month crash course for trainees interested in pursuing IT as a career prospect. The aim of YDP is to provide opportunities to the underprivileged community youth to empower themselves economically by improving their employability through specific training skills. The YDP works towards enhancing leadership skills of the trainees through confidence building exercises and providing them placements according to their interests and skills.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME – TARAMANI, CHENNAI

The Skill Training centre was inaugurated on 7th April 2017 in Taramani, Chennai by BACI officials Senior VP Mr. Raja Gottumukkala, Mr. Senthil, Mr. Sivagurunathan, Mr. Raghu and Mr. Kalyan. The guest while addressing the members and trainees - emphasized the importance of the youth development and encouraged and motivated the new trainees to put their best effort into the program.

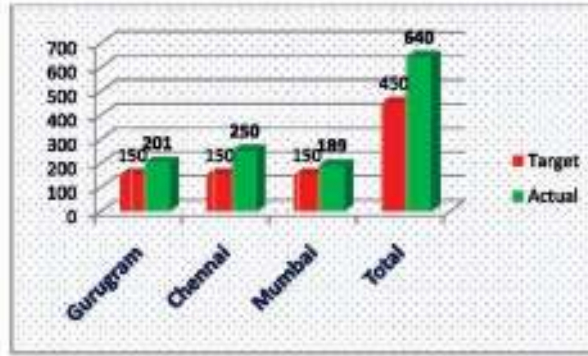

Impact:

- ❖ 640 underprivileged youth were trained and 79% trained youths were successfully placed in jobs.
- ❖ Youths are given opportunity to work in organized sectors which otherwise most of them would have ended up in unorganized sectors where exploitation is a usual happening.
- ❖ Youths in jobs are able to finance their own education (enrolled through distance learning) and also support the financial needs of their families
- ❖ The community became aware about the need for training of youths to empower them economically.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROGRAMME FOR THE RAG PICKING COMMUNITY CHILDREN OF NORTH-EAST DELHI (GALI PRE SCHOOL)



The project mainly focuses on children between the age of 3-5 years of rag picking community of North East Delhi and enable the parents to get their children admitted to Government schools post the age of 5 years.

The aim of the project is to nurture holistic development of children in the age group 3-5 years in the slum of the North East Delhi to ensure active learning process among them. The focus areas are the populations of

Seemapuri and Rajeev Nagar. The Instructors in the Gali schools belong to the same communities and trained by ADF, offer their homes as the venues for the classes.

10 Gali Pre Schools were launched in the slums of Seemapuri and Rajeev Nagar. The concept of this project is to utilize the community resources and enabled maximum participation in the development process.

YOUTH EMPLOYABILITY PROGRAMME(YEP) – CHENNAI (PUZHUTHIVAKKAM AND SAIDAPET)

There are strong linkages between unemployment, underemployment, shortage of decent jobs and poverty. Eradication of poverty requires sustained macro-economic stability coupled with an enabling environment for investments that contributes to productive employment creation. Most youth subsist on the margins of the economy or have jobs that do not provide them with adequate means to ensure survival.

The Youth Employability Programme is designed to provide strategic and sustainable interventions for the youth to enable them effectively participate in the National development and improve their quality of life. The Programme focuses on Skills training and placement.

Asha Deep Foundation with the support of Cognizant Foundation launched in Chennai its Youth Employability Programme (YEP) with a commitment to reach 900 youth in 3 years by providing skill training on Basic Computer, Spoken English, Customer Care, Retail, Hospitality, Personality Development, Life skills and Financial Literacy. After completion of the training the organization provides 75% placements to the trained youth.

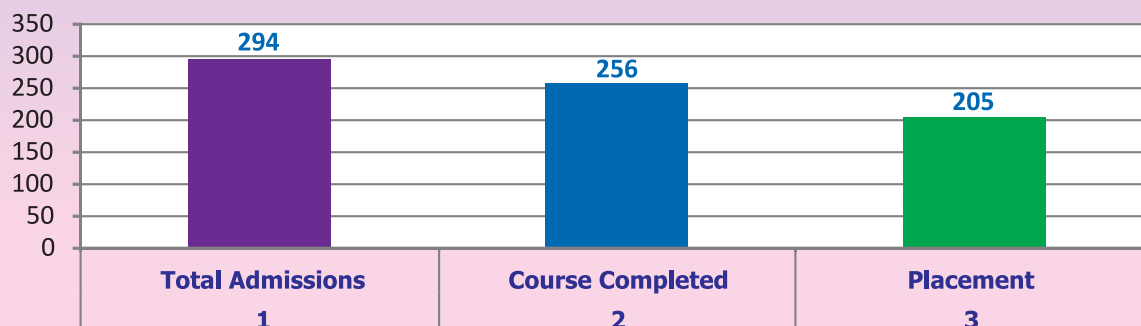
- 530 underprivileged youth were trained and 82% trained youths were successfully placed in jobs.

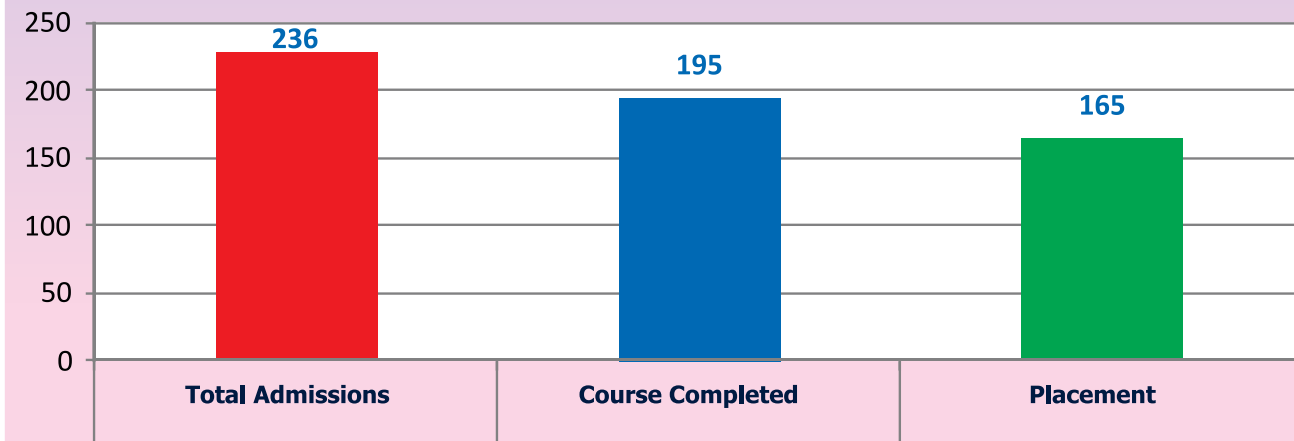

ST. JAMES CONVENT SCHOOL FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED AND MINORITY CHILDREN



INTRODUCTION

The education program of the Asha Deep Foundation is committed to providing basic education to the underprivileged children. Founder, Late Fr. A.R. Rajamoney realized this when he visited the slums of Shahid Nagar when there were no schools nearby. With a spark in his eyes to catalyse change, he laid the bricks for Education and Holistic Development. His journey has seen various obstacles, but he overcame them all to satiate his desire to bring India's development forwards through empowerment. It has positively impacted more than 35,000 students who have graduated from this school with a passion to take over the world and bring about change in their community.



St. James Convent School caters to underprivileged and minority children residing in nearby areas like Shahid Nagar, Seemapuri, Pappu Colony, Shalimar Garden, Ganeshpuri, Pasonda and more. It provides quality education to students with an aim to empower each individual to shape their lives. St. James Convent School strategically implements new learning methodologies which are innovative and outcome driven. Focus is given on kindling the curiosity and thought process of each child through different activities. Teachers, volunteers and mentors are mobilized, trained, and monitored by ADF at frequent intervals. Extra classes are provided to slow learners for equitable education. Emphasis is given on grassroots learning and on the use of Teaching Learning Methods (TLM) for effective results. Parents take an active part in the functioning of the school management committee. Parents are regularly called for parents-teachers meeting and are given updates on the performance of their children. Matters like hygiene, importance of education and other areas of importance are also discussed with parents. The school helps the children's minds to blossom and provide a platform for individual thinking and holistic development.

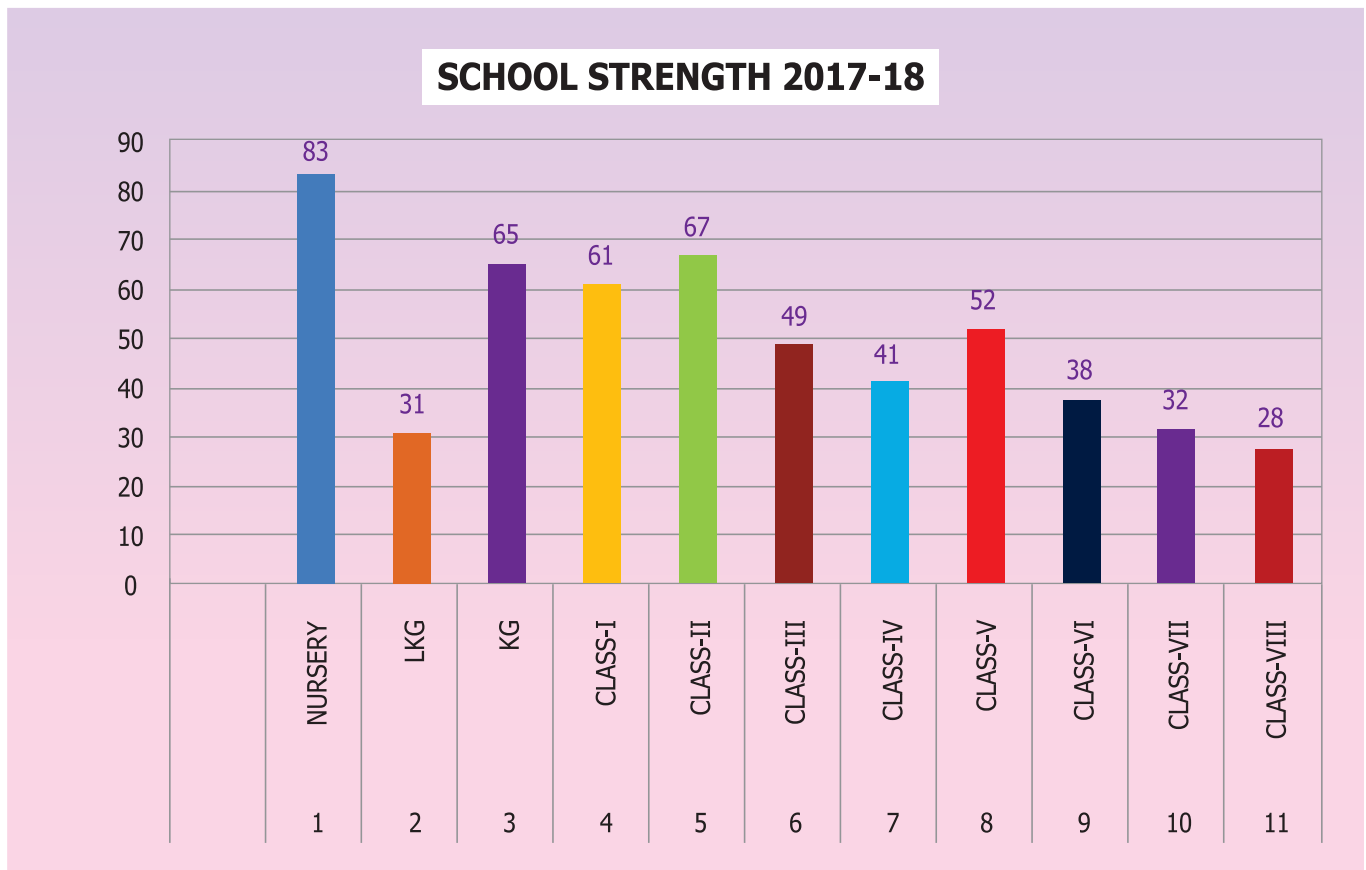

STRENGTH OF ST. JAMES CONVENT SCHOOL -2017-18



ASHA DEEP BOYS & GIRLS HOSTEL



The Asha Deep Boys & Girls Hostel was started in April 2016 in partnership with India Vision Foundation. The hostel seeks to rehabilitate Boys & Girls whose parents are convicted and currently incarcerated. The purpose of this undertaking is to normalize the lives of children who have incurred trauma as a result of separation from their parents. The hostel facilities ensure all round development, by providing them with quality education, nutritious meals, health facilities, regular counselling etc.



All children of the hostel attend St. James Convent School run by Asha Deep Foundation. Inside the hostel, wardens and teachers give the students extra tuition if they require extra support in any subject. Their daily routine consists of activities such as yoga, meditation, schooling, indoor and outdoor games, extracurricular activities etc. They are provided with a library in the premises to incubate self-learning and reading habits. The food menu of the mess is changed every 3 months keeping in mind the preferences and nutritional requirements of the children. After school hours, some children of the hostel also attend the Asha Vocational Technical Training Institute to learn Vocational skills such as Beauty Culture, Tailoring etc. Children are provided 24 hours health care by the specialized health team.

ASHA CRÈCHE FOR THE RAG-PICKER'S COMMUNITY CHILDREN



The Asha Crèche in partnership with Infogain is one of the project of the ADF and has been running for the past 10 years. The crèche caters to children between the ages of two to five. These children belong to rag picking families and other underprivileged communities in Seemapuri and adjoining areas of North-East Delhi and Ghaziabad. The purpose of this project is to provide a nurturing, safe and hygienic environment which the kids are deprived of, due to their socio-economic status. By providing the

crèche facilities, parents are discouraged from taking their offspring to the dumping grounds with them, where they would be exposed to hazardous conditions. Instead, they are asked to leave their children in safe hands at the crèche – a clean and playful environment.



In addition to providing a physically safe and clean environment, ADF adopts a holistic approach in order to develop children's physical, emotional, social, cognitive and linguistic skills. Basic play school education is imparted to the kids. This includes alphabets, rhymes, counting, animal names, fruits and vegetables names, etc. All essential supplies such as writing slates, crayons, and other stationery are provided by the crèche. With the help of music, games and child-friendly TLMs, children learn through active participation. Here, both children and parents are educated about the importance of maintaining hygiene at home as well. Every year, events such as the Annual Day, Christmas celebration, Sports Day and picnic outings are organised for the parents and children.



Impact:

In the past year, a total of 90 children have been enrolled in the Asha Creche, out of which 56 were boys and 34 girls. Once the children turn 5 years old, they are enrolled in Government schools with the assistance of ADF. Community Mobilizers of ADF do regular follow-ups and ensure that the admitted children do not drop out of school. Awareness programs and monthly health check-ups by the Community Health Department of ADF help to ensure the well-being of all children at the crèche.

Childline work for the protection of the rights of all children in general but especially Childline focus on all children in need of care and protection.

- Awareness about CHILDLINE 1098 amongst every Indian child.

- To work together with the Allied Systems (Police, Health Care, Juvenile Justice, Transport, Legal, Education, Communication, Media, Political and the Community) to create child friendly systems.
- To advocate services for children that is inaccessible or nonexistent.
- To create a body of NGOs and Government organisations working within the national framework and policy for children.
- To be a nodal child protection agency in the country, providing child protection services to children in need of care and protection.
- To contribute and work towards strengthening and participating in a global movement that addresses issues related to child protection and ensures that children's voices are heard.

Asha Vocational and Technical Training Institute (AVTTI)

Vocational training helps the youth to achieve financial independence by learning new skills. Asha Vocational Technical and Training Institute provide qualitative training in vocational and technical trade to the underprivileged youth in developing their skills so that in future they are able to sustain themselves through self-reliance. The project has been running successfully in Shahid Nagar community by providing Cutting & Tailoring, Beauty Culture, Computer Software etc. The objective of this centre is to develop entrepreneurial and business skill among the youth so that they can start their own venture or business in the future.

Under AVTTI two batches of trainees are run through Cutting & tailoring, Beauty culture and Computer courses. The age group of the trainees lies between 14 to 35 years. Courses are available for 6 months or a one-year period. An assembly is held on every last Wednesday of each month, where the trainees monthly progress is reviewed and course completion certificates are distributed to the trainees who have successfully completed the course.

On 20th January, Alumni Day is celebrated at AVTTI in which trainees, who have completed their course at AVTTI, participate and share their experiences and insights with the currently enrolled trainees.

Impact:

So far, a total of 335 underprivileged adolescent girls and women have been trained under the AVTTI programme. Out of these, 121 trainees were trained in Beauty culture course and 214 of Cutting and tailoring. Post completion, many trainees have started their own ventures. Others, have started working with already established ventures located in nearby areas. These trainees have also inspired and motivated other young girls and women in the community to undergo the vocational training provided by AVTTI.



COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAMMES

The community health program of Asha Deep Foundation provides health care facilities especially to the deprived and underprivileged community. There is a component of health care in all the projects. The health department provides preventive and curative health care, General OPD, DOTS- TB, Pulse polio, Pre- natal and post natal care, Health camps etc. It also works towards spreading awareness about maintaining good health in the neighbouring communities on various occasions like World Health Day, World No Tobacco Day, World TB Day and World AIDS day.

TB Control Programme:



To work towards India's goal of eradicating TB by 2025 Asha Deep Foundation (ADF) has been working on improving the health of the underprivileged community for the last three decades. ADF initiated its TB Control Programme in the year 1985 and has working in association with the Government of India's NTCP (now RNTCP-Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program) since 1990. The TB Control Program is currently run through ADF's community health centre in Shahid Nagar.

The occurrence of TB in the nearby areas of Shahid Nagar is quite prevalent due to overcrowding, poorly ventilated houses, social stigma, health care deprivation, malnutrition, smoking, stress, poverty and a lack of physical health seeking behaviour. Despite all these challenges Asha Deep Foundation has been successfully running the Tuberculosis Control Program at the Community Health Centre and serving the people in the local communities.

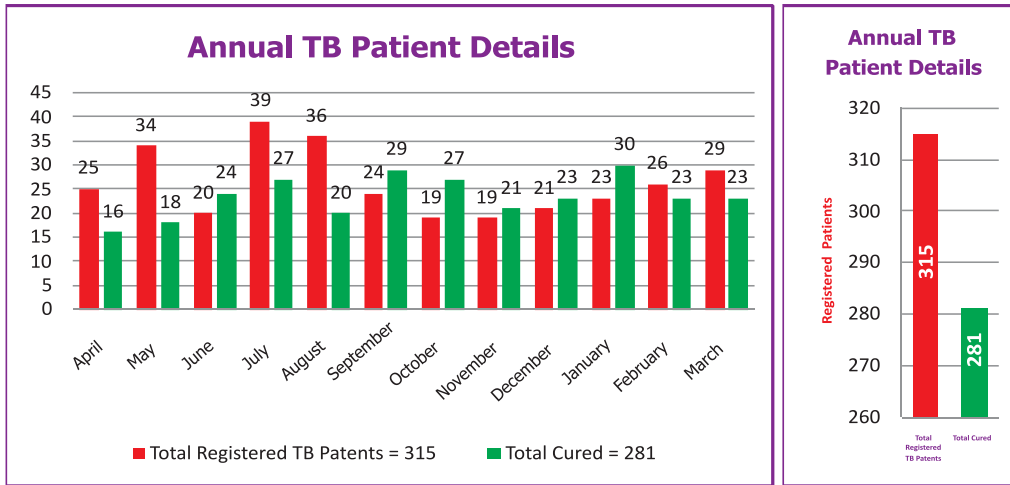
TB Awareness efforts made by ADF in the region have resulted in an increased number of patients visiting the centre. The TB control programme starts with the collection of the sputum of the person suspected to be suffering from TB. If the result of the sputum test turns out to be positive then they are referred to government hospitals for blood sugar and HIV test. After completion of all the tests, the patients are given complete DOTS treatment at the Community Health centre of ADF. The follow-up of the patients during the course of the treatment is again a major activity performed at ADF to make sure that patients under treatment are taking medicines regularly and following the treatment guidelines.





Impact:

TB had a strong grip on Shahid Nagar communities few years back, affecting most of the residents. ADF rose to the occasion and has positively impacted the lives of the local community. With the help of the TB DOTS initiative, the number of patients affected by TB in this community has drastically dropped over the years. So far, a total of 315 patients have been registered under the program out of which 281 were cured.

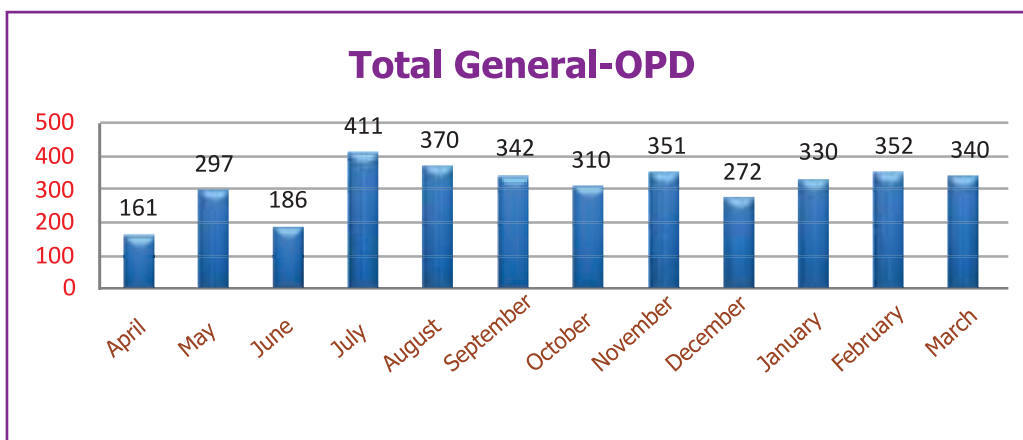


General OPD :



Health is always a major concern in a large country like India. The problem is especially deeply rooted within the marginalized section of the society due to a lack of knowledge, low economic status, unclean surroundings, and lack of personal hygiene, lack of easy access to health services and a lack of health-seeking behaviour. ADF in its effort to work towards the goal of providing healthcare to all especially to the people from underprivileged section of the society provides OPD services in Shahid Nagar area, so that

the people in the nearby districts can easily access the healthcare facilities.





Health Awareness Programme

The underprivileged section of the society faces severe health challenges due to lack of proper awareness regarding various diseases. ADF believes in the motto "Prevention is better than cure" and thus spreading health awareness is an important component of its Community Health Programme.

ADF works towards preventive healthcare. Through its Community Health Department, It takes up various activities to spread awareness on various diseases and educates people about the various measures to avoid them. The activities include health talks with beneficiaries of different projects of ADF, door to door visits to create awareness among family members and group discussions. Important days such as World TB day, World Health Day, World No Tobacco Day and World AIDS day are celebrated to inform the children and community people of the various health related issues and their easy prevention.

MULTI SERVICE CENTRES

Development and Rehabilitation Center for Differently Abled Children

Children with disabilities in India are often subject to multiple deprivations and limited opportunities in several dimensions of their lives. Their families and caregivers also experience a lot of stress and challenges caring for a person with disability at home, as it can often lead to grave discrimination practices towards them and these children. ADF believes that bridging the gap between haves and have-nots will lead to social inclusion and India's development. Therefore ADF is running Development and Rehabilitation Center for Differently Abled Children in Shahid Nagar, to cater for the needs of underprivileged differently abled children from the neighboring slums since 1983 with a strong focus on overall and healthy development of each child, ADF delivers counseling and guidance, as they are strong and essential help in tools.



ADF identify children with special needs and convince their parents to send their child to the center. ADF supports the differently-abled through training, therapy, special education and counseling, with the aim of helping them to lead independent lives and equipping them to perform their own tasks independently. Daily routine activities include prayers, yoga, literacy class, recreational activities, speech therapy, indoor/outdoor games, activity-based training and nutritional care. Monthly health checkups are conducted to ensure the health of each child by the Community Health Department of ADF. Parents are counseled in regards to the special needs of their children and developmental activities that they need to practice at home. Remedial classes for those who attend St. James Convent School are held for the children.





Impact:

Currently 25 differently-abled children are enrolled in this center. This program has positively impacted the lives of differently-abled children and enabled them to lead normal lives. Parents are now more supportive and supplement ADF's efforts by bringing normalcy in the life of their children.

Asha Integrated Program For Senior Citizens

The organization works to benefit society as a whole, without alienating any segment of it. Through its 'Asha Integrated Program for Senior Citizens', ADF has established a Day Care Center in Seemapuri for senior citizens who receive unkind treatment from their own children or have been abandoned from their homes. This project was launched to address the urgent needs of these people who demand care and love at this stage in their life. Currently 25 Senior Citizens regularly attend the day care center, who come in for around 7-8 hours every day. All these members have found a new family and spend whole days happily in the company of each other.



ADF not only provides a daycare-facility for these members but also promote well-being through social and health-related services. The senior citizens who have difficulties in getting regular pensions are facilitated to get regular pension.

The day care center starts with meditation, yoga, news paper reading, indoor games and other recreational activities throughout the day. They are also provided three nutritious meals in a day. The social worker visits the house of senior citizens regularly and counsels the family members. Due to this the some of the family members have started respecting their parents. Regular health checkups are also conducted by the health team of Asha Deep Foundation.

Asha Computer Institute for Girls

The underprivileged adolescent girls in India are stuck due to poverty, lack of diverse education and skill-building opportunities. Adolescent Girls are often pulled out of school to take over household responsibilities. Even in cases where they complete their education, they aren't given the opportunity to work. So, Asha Deep Foundation took the initiative to start a Computer Institute exclusively for the underprivileged adolescent girls.

This institute provides qualitative training in computer software to develop their skills so that they could sustain and become self-sustained in their future. Through the training programme the trainees are trained to develop their personality, built their confidence and self-esteem.

Asha Fashion Designing Training Center for Girls



Asha Deep Foundation is running Cutting and Tailoring course since 1983 for the adolescent girls/women of the underprivileged community. As the market trends are changing, slowly the traditional trade like cutting and tailoring is in less demand and more demand for fashion designing course. During the community meeting with the women/girls, they expressed their interest to learn fashion designing course. So, the organisation decided to start the



course in November 2017. The organisation conducted a random survey and registered 54 adolescent girls from Kalender colony, Jain Mandir, Sunlight Colony and New Seemapuri. The course is for one year; during the course the trainees are taken for exposure visits to understand the market needs and to interact with the fashion designers. After completion of the training all the trainees are awarded with certificate.

Impact:

The institute has succeeded in empowering young girls/women and help them to realize their potentials. In turn, these adolescent girls/women become role models within the community and are promoting the benefits of possessing the above mentioned skills. So far, a total of 155 girls/women have enrolled under the programmes out of which 101 were computer skills trainees and 54 were from fashion designing course. The programme has provided these trainees with the opportunity to gain accredited, marketable work skills which in turn lead to employment opportunities.

RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION PROGRAMMES

Ashaniketan Home for Boys & Girls

The Ashaniketan Home is a home away from home; it has been providing shelter to a number of homeless and destitute children for the past 24 years. It has established a deep-rooted holistic approach for the growth and development of the children. It is a residential based development programme for the children who are run away, orphans, semi-orphans, abandoned, lost, destitute etc.

Initially, upon joining, the children are reserved and hardly interact with anybody or their peers. This is the result of distress suffered in the past. ADF's nurturing environment and regular counselling helps them to gain confidence and confide in others. This helps in bringing back normalcy and optimism in their lives. ADF makes continuous efforts to trace the homes of the lost kids, but for those children whose families are not traced are admitted in St. James Convent School run by Asha Deep Foundation. After completion of the school the organisation helps them to pursue higher education and also provides skill training to lead independent lives.

Remedial Classes for the Rag Picker's Community Children

Education is one of the major focus areas the Asha Deep Foundation works in and children are the main beneficiaries. Children who are dropped out from schools or who have never attended schools are prepared in Remedial center and ultimately enrolled in formal schools. The fact of the matter is that after enrollment in formal schools many children drop out from schools due to various reasons such as inability to cope with studies, lack of support from parents, lack of quality education in government schools and parents' inability to afford private tuitions. So, remedial education for school going children in the rag picking community is extremely important to fulfill the aim of educating children in the community. The Remedial center helps the children to cope up with the pressure of their studies and prevent dropping out from schools and also bring in all-round development among children. The activities are carried out for the holistic development of children and also to retain children in formal education. These activities are taken up under the project, namely Parents Teachers' Meeting, Health Checkup, Sports Meet, Festival Celebration, Home Visit, Personality Development, Yoga and Meditation, Storytelling, Group discussion, Sports and Game, Art & Craft etc.

Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Project

The living condition of the rag picking community is unhealthy and unhygienic, socially & economically poor. They are not emphasis on their personal Health, Hygiene and sanitation and ignore the general measure of the health. They are lack awareness on health and hygiene. The aim of WASH project is to aware the community on health, personal hygiene, sanitation, Govt. policies on water and sanitation for a better life and to prevent from infectious diseases so that they can improve and develop themselves socially and economically. Door to door visits, group meetings with adolescent girls and women, community meetings, focused group discussions were conducted to aware people on health, personal hygiene, sanitation, Govt. policies on water and sanitation.

SPORTS FOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Sports for Social Development is a method of bringing about social change through the use of sports. It refers to the physical activity and development is any individual, health, social, and economic benefits. So Asha Deep Foundation initiated sports activities for the development among the underprivileged children of the community. The organization provides both indoor and outdoor sports activities such as Football, Cricket, Basket Ball, Table Tennis, carom, chess etc. Delhi Dynamos issue free tickets to the orphanage children to watch Indian Super League and also invite the children escort the players.



The goal of the project include sensitizing and advocating the Child's Right to play, promoting gender equality, developing personal and social skills and bringing communities together through sporting opportunities by giving exposure to excellence and fair play. The children are also taken to view national matches like Indian Super League -Football, Indian Super Fight, etc. to encourage them to participate in sports activities. The organization not only focuses on curriculum but also provides opportunities to those children who aim to take sports as their career.

PSYCHO- SOCIAL CARE

Student unmet mental health needs can be a significant barrier to their development. This can affect their academic, personal and social sphere, as well as their future careers. Asha Deep Foundation addresses this issue through its Pyscho-social care. It promotes emotional wellness for individuals and communities through social counseling. A lot of underprivileged children enrolled in various facilities of Asha Deep Foundation face mental and emotional trauma from early childhood. ADF believes that every individual has the right to lead a normal and peaceful life. To ensure the holistic development of children, experienced counsellors act with utmost care and delicacy in handling the issues in a professional manner. Socially hesitant or insecure students are dealt with in an affectionate way so that they might open up and don't isolate themselves.



Students in the Ashaniketan Boys Home, Ashaniketan Girls Home, Asha Deep Hostel for boys, Asha Deep Hostel for girls, Day Care Centre for Special Children and St. James Convent School are covered under this scheme. Over the years, ADF has helped students come out of trauma and stabilize their mental health. It has yielded great results since its inception. Students who undergo these sessions, participate much more in activities and show an increased interest in performing academically. It also fosters co-operative peer interactions, newfound confidence in students and the acquisition of decision making skills.



Human Resource Development & Training Centre (HRD)

The most important asset of any organization is its Human Resource department. Asha Deep Foundation, in an attempt to keep innovating, looks after the training and development of its people in HRD & Training Centers. Capacity building training for project managers, teachers, community mobilizers and volunteers are conducted regularly in this center. Workshops on other diverse topics like team building, conflict resolution, leadership, negotiation skills etc. are held for the target group. Benefits of such workshops appear in the form of increased productivity, job satisfaction, low attrition rate and improved motivation. ADF constantly upgrades itself with relevant skills to adapt to changing times. New ideas, concepts and developmental strategies are imparted to the employees through these programs. ADF is doing its every bit to ensure that their employees remain skillful.



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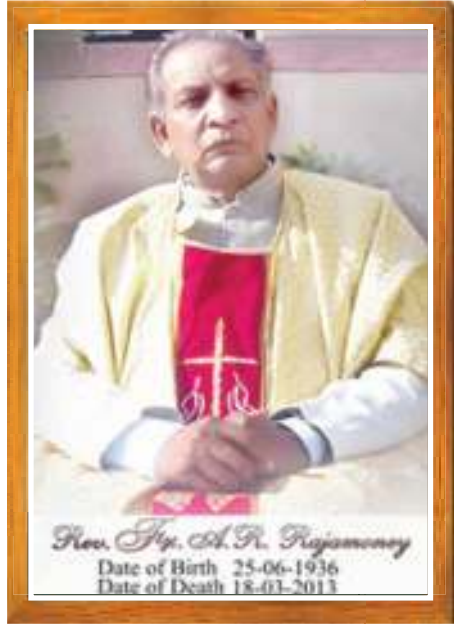
Documentation, Monitoring and Evaluation

The success of the project rely on effective documentation, monitoring and evaluation system . Documentation is as important as implementing the project and makes things more real. The project staff documents their work on regular basis in the form of daily diary, monthly, quarterly, half yearly and annually. Documents can be exciting, inspiring, and creative forms of expression if it is done in a proper manner. It is a "living" data, intended to be evolving road maps that can empower the project team long after the completion of the project and deliver ables have been handed over to the community. Asha Deep Foundation makes sure the documentation done is used for the longest period and inform the next iteration of thinking. The organization through documentation sets expectations, provides clarity, and creates safety nets and empowers the team to make certain decisions and have them backed up. The documentation, when done successfully, can keep forward momentum in place, keep the team focused and achieve the goal of the project.

Monitoring & Evaluation help in understanding whether the project is going in line with the aims and objectives and can be re-strategized, if needed, for bringing the project back on track. It is a process that helps to improve the performance and achieve results. Asha Deep Foundation has its in built documentation, planning , monitoring and evaluation system which is used to assess the performance of projects, institutions and programs. Every month during the Manager's Meeting , the project managers present their project reports with indicators both quantitative and qualitative and to see that the activities are achieving their objectives in every stage of progress. Internal evaluation of each project is conducted by the evaluation committee which is carried out quarterly and the reports of the committee is presented to the Management which helps to make the required change based on evaluation report. In addition to the regular monitoring from within the organisation, external evaluation agencies are periodically assessed the success and progress of the Asha Deep Foundation.
